About us: We are an Independent Congregational church. This means the church is governed by our members, rather than by a denomination or bishop. We seek to be faithful to God's Word, the Bible, in all that we believe and how we live

We believe that He rose again from the dead and that all who belong to him will one day share in that resurrection.
